Domestic Violence is a pattern of abusive behavior by the following:

- a current or former spouse or intimate partner
- a person with whom the victim shares a child in common
- a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner

Dating Violence is violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim.

Dating Violence includes:

- Sexual Abuse – Non consensual sexual contact
- Physical Abuse – Any act of another party involving contact intended to cause feelings of physical pain, injury or other physical suffering or bodily harm.

Intimate Partner Violence describes sexual, physical, or psychological harm by a former or current partner or spouse. This type of violence can occur among same-sex or heterosexual couples and does not require sexual intimacy.

Domestic, dating and intimate partner violence do not discriminate and can happen regardless of race, age, sexual orientation, religion, gender or gender identity. The abuse in both domestic and dating violence relationships can be sexual, emotional, verbal, physical, or economical.

If you find yourself in an abusive relationship, whether domestic, dating or intimate partner, or if you know a student who is struggling in one of these relationships, reach out for help and support.
